**EXAMPLE OF Jackie Dunn's BARN/WINTER INSTRUCTIONS**

**HORSES:**

Reno – buckskin gelding – 16 years  
 Sky – bay mare – 16 years  
 Chiquita – buckskin filly – 2 years  
 Sasquatch – bay gelding – 16 years

**CAT:**

Furry – black long hair cat. Lives in hay stack and eats on wooden trunk

**MORNINGS;**

Reno - Sky and Chiquita all get ½ scoop (cottage cheese container) of Safe Choice Grain in black barrel. Reno eats in a bucket on south wall, Sky next to him in feeder and Chiquita in pen.  
 Sasquatch – ½ scoop safe choice with 2 T Aniprin (2 scoops of large end of Measure.). If available, ¼ of ointment in R eye (tacrolimus)

1-2 flakes hay for each horse

Furry – canned food if available or dry food in red tool box in hay pen.

**CHECK STOCK TANK** – if needs filing, connect hose and put in tank. Go to house and downstairs in corner by dryer, lift up silver handle. Be sure to turn off. It takes about 15 min to fill tank.

**EVENINGS:**

Same as mornings except no meds for Sasquatch.

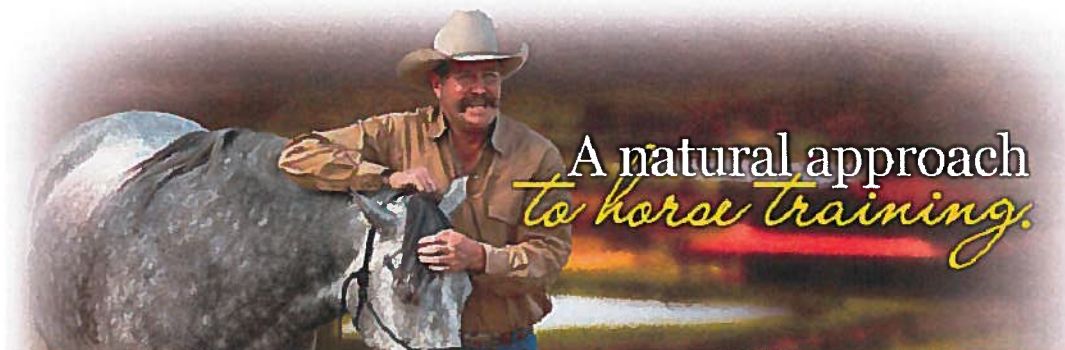

# Revealing Your Horse's Aptitude -a Horse Training Article by Linda Parelli

Just like people, some horses are more suitable for certain jobs or activities, and trying to make a horse do something that he doesn't have the aptitude for can make things challenging.

It's like trying to push a round peg through a square hole. The more mismatched the shapes, the harder it is; and the harder you push it, the more damage you are likely to cause.

In the performance world, trainers and competitors have defined a profile for the ideal horse as a jumper, cutter, reiner, eventer, endurance mount—whatever your chosen discipline. They look for a certain athletic type, breed, disposition and spirit level because time and experience have proven that this style of horse is more likely to be successful in the competition.

In the recreational world, the options are very diverse and don't necessarily involve riding or competition. The goal is primarily to have fun with the horse in whatever form that takes, and to be able to do things like take relaxing trail rides with friends. So what happens when you end up with a horse that is scared to death of being in foreign territory with a bunch of strange horses, or you have a horse with more ambition than average that just wants to poke around?

Finally, there are kid horses. If you were shopping for a horse for your precious child, what horse should you look for? How do you find the kind, gentle spirit to which you can entrust a young human life?

Understanding horses at a deeper level will help you select the right horse for your endeavor as well as adapt yourself and the horse you have to reach your goal without sacrificing the relationship. It's all about Horsenality (each horse's personality) aptitude.

## Working with Your Horse's Horsenality™

**Parelli Horsenality Chart**

Pat and Linda Parelli have developed a program to help you better understand your horse's individual behavior and temperament characteristics.

To identify your horse's horsenality, consider every trait listed on the chart to the right and make a dot on the specific ring that best corresponds to your horse. For example, if your horse is extremely playful, you would put a dot on the outer "extreme" ring under this trait. If he is non-responsive, but only some of the time, you would put a dot on the middle "moderate" ring by this trait. Some of the traits may not apply to your horse at all. You can have dots in different quadrants, but the vast majority of horses will end up with most of their dots in one quadrant, which reveals that horse's horsenality.

Once you have identified your horse's horsenality profile using the chart, here are some strategies for working effectively with each horsenality type for a more successful partnership.

**The Right Brain Extrovert needs safety. Never push him past the threshold until he's calm. You will need to retreat and to interrupt the pattern. You must have a strong focus and must match the horse's high energy level. Give him a job to accomplish to replace his fear with something positive. He must think of you as his "safe place."**

**The Right Brain Introvert needs comfort. The worst thing you can do is push this horse before he's confident. You'll ruin his trust in you if you push him before he's ready. Taking your time is important because you'll need to wait on this horse to process things. He needs to believe in you.**

**The Left Brain Extrovert needs play. He craves creative, imaginative tasks and can't stand to be forced into anything. Because he hates to be bored, you'll need to speed things up, be enthusiastic and come up with variety in your lessons.**

**The Left Brain Introvert needs incentive. There are plenty of ways to offer incentive without "bribing" him. (Think rest, grazing, treats, scratches.) This horse needs to have a purpose and wants to go somewhere. Riding circles in an area with this horse will lead to resistance and defiance. Use reverse psychology for best results.**

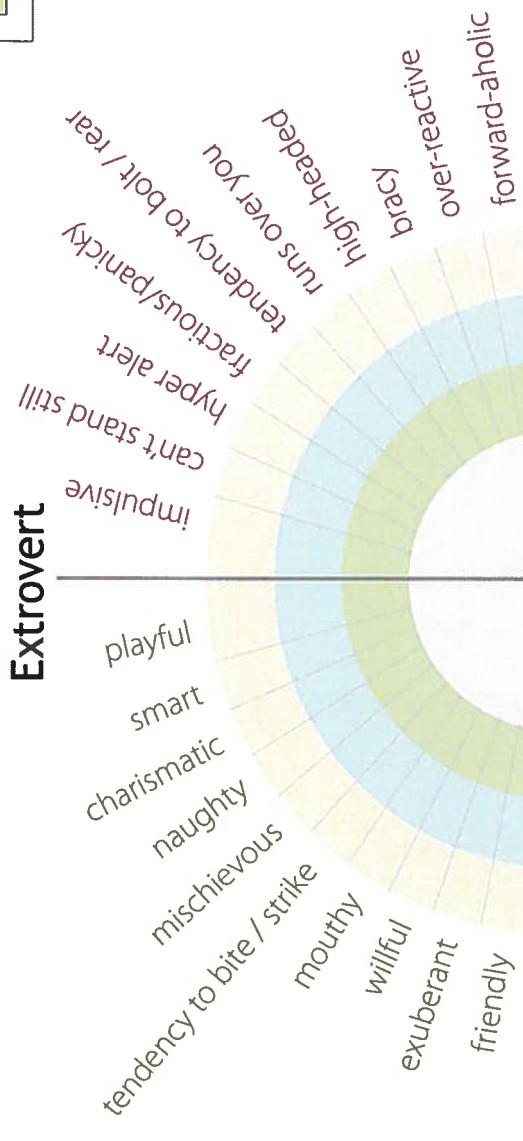
